PRAGUE (Czech Republic)

2 to 8 July 2026

From 2 to 8 July 2026, the Summer University in Prague was organised successfully once more in the Czech capital in collaboration with CEVRO University. It was the opportunity to develop the very topical theme “Geopolitics in Central and Eastern Europe”.

Around 30 candidates took part in the programme, partly from the Czech Republic selected by CEVRO and partly from many different countries, selected by CIFE and the partner. They represented 12 different nationalities.

All the candidates who successfully completed the programme received a certificate of participation. Additionally, students who did some extra work after the session acquired ECTS credits.

At the end of the session, we also asked our students to fill out an evaluation questionnaire and comment upon our programme. Their observations were a great help for us for the continuation of the programme.

We hope that this session in Prague will be a very nice memory for everyone, and we warmly thank our partner, CEVRO University, for this friendly collaboration.

As for the logistics, the hotel, which was very close both to the university and and the city centre, was highly appreciated, especially for its extraordinary breakfast. The restaurant that hosted the group for working lunches offered a three-course menu that was more than sufficient, even though the vegetarian participants noted that there wasn't really a suitable option for them, despite the fact that the menus had been arranged in advance. However, we must take into account the country's cuisine, whose meals are often heavier than what most of us are used to eating.
